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Polar bears

hand sewing (raw edge) and embroidery



Requirements:

Mummy polar bear measures 8 ½ inches (22 cm) from her bottom to her nose
Her babies (coys) measure 4 inches (10cm)
Fabric- blanket, fleece or felt (something which won't fray)
Toy stuffing or leftover wadding scraps
Scissors
Needles, pins
Sewing thread- grey and cream
Embroidery silk- black

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Stitching Instructions

- 1. **Cut paper pattern template:** Cut the polar bears out and pin to your chosen fabric (double thickness).
- 2. **Cut fabric**: Cut out two bodies for each polar bear.
- 3. **Embroider**: Stitch ears using grey sewing thread. Embroider eyes in black embroidery silk- I used French knots. The nose and mouth are embroidered after stuffing the polar bears.
- 4. **Sew polar bears**: Place *wrong sides* together and stitch round their bodies using a whip stitch. Leave a section of the back open for stuffing. Hide your stitches or make them worth looking at!
- 5. **Stuff:** Using toy stuffing or leftover wadding fill your polar bears. Be careful not to over-stuff, as the seams will only rip if you do.
- 6. **Sew back closed:** Sew the opening closed.
- 7. **Embroider:** Stitch noses and mouths onto the polar bears using black embroidery silk and little stitches.
- 8. **Admire**. And never, ever point out your mistakes!



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
